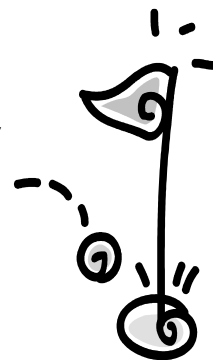
Employment Network

The St. Vincent de Paul Society is a small parish-oriented organization of men and women who have joined together to help their neighbors in need. Good will rewards those who care and share.

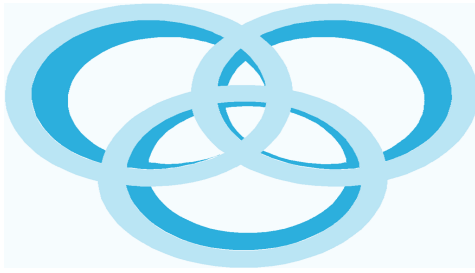

These number about twenty by and include special editions for moms, dads, teenagers, grandparents, and every other category of reader. They even include a book devoted to pets.

It's no wonder these books are so popular. In our crazy world, we hear many stories dealing with violence, fraud, theft, and abuse. Other stories, especially on TV, deal with the most abusive types of behavior found in fellow human beings. I can understand our voyeurism in watching some of these programs once or twice because they are so foreign to our every day life. But why this type of program proliferates into every imaginable nasty program exploited on TV is beyond me.

Maybe these programs help people recognize problem areas beginning to occur in their homes, such as Hoarders. Consumerism is rampant in our country and people frequently buy more things than they need and not even use them. But the thought occurs to me that many programs teach people to act weirdly. Bridezillas, Housewives/NYC, Repo, Hell's Kitchen, and Toddlers & Tiaras do nothing to encourage respect and dignity for themselves or others. One wonders what kind of adults our kids will grow up to be, having had so much of this information shown to them over the years.

Parents have a tough job teaching their children to be worthwhile human beings because they get so little help from our negative media. How are we to impress upon our youth that they are children of God; that their bodies are temples of the Holy Spirit; and that we have an obligation to love God and others as ourselves? Not easily.

So back to "chicken soup". The reason they are so popular, I think, is because they remind us of the goodness in people – the every day kind of goodness. The families who really are fulfilling their obligation as they provide for their families and teach their children real values, the neighbors who lend a hand, the relatives who love and support each other, and the friends who share the joys and sorrows of our lives. They are so important to us and we are so grateful to have them. These stories are truly good for the soul!

From the Pastor . . .

This is our 4th of July weekend. A time for us to remember the principles upon which our nation was founded. As time moves on, we tend to forget the reasons behind our great nation. It is said that Americans are quickly forgetting their history. It's a good time for us to nurture and build upon the gifts of individuals and groups who helped found our nation. It's a good time to show appreciation to our God for His many gifts to us and our country. God is really part of our story and history as a country. Let's remember and keep in mind the many steps we take forward and renew them for the good of all.

We are all familiar with situations in which words failed us. We all experience a time or another when we find ourselves at a loss for words. A friend tells that her husband is leaving and we struggle for the right words. Another friend tells us that he or she has terminal cancer. A coworker is fired, a child is killed, a son is arrested for drug possession, a neighbors picture is plastered all over the front of a newspaper because of bribery charges. We struggle for words, sometimes we settle for any word because something has to be said. Sometimes, the words just remain hidden from us and we remain speechless.

In the past year, I was called to the hospital. The children were grieving the loss of their mom. I had my ritual prayer book with me, but the prayers all seemed hollow. I was at a loss but my loss was dwarfed by the sadness that shrouded the room. I made the sign of the cross and read from the ritual. I began the prayer Hail Holy Queen, hearing for the first time the real meaning of "to you we cry, the children of Eve; to you we send up our sighs, mourning and weeping in this valley of tears." As I continued beyond this prayer, I made up prayers as I went along. I assure you that the prayers were not my doing; they were a gift from the Holy Spirit. I trusted and God worked through me.

When confronted with a situation that leaves us at a loss for the right words, we can do no better than to imitate Isaiah and trust that God will give us the words to rouse the weary, to comfort the loss and confused. "The Lord has given me a well-trained tongue, that I might know how to speak to the weary a word that will rouse them. (Isaiah 50: 4-9)

PRAYER: May God help us grow ever more dependent on the gift of the Holy Spirit as we face the challenges of life.
