...Valuing Our Tradition

Many products these days have been subject to recalls – from cars to plastic bottles and everything in between. Recently at daily Mass in the church, we heard about the prophet, Amos from the Old Testament. Amos was a prophet of extremes who didn't believe in a middle road. Amos had no tolerance for half-hearted attempts at living God's law. Amos tells us to hate evil and love good. Basically, there's no room for compromise in the world of Amos.

In our time, we have become comfortable with a watered down version of the godly life. We want to be good but we don't want to be singled out as a fanatic of any kind. We too often try to keep our relationship with God as a private matter. In fact, most people wouldn't even know that we are active Catholics by the way we live outside the walls of our parish church..

Amos is telling us today that we are to stand up for goodness and God's way of living. He further challenges us to actually hate the evil around us. He challenges us to take action in order to combat the ways of darkness that thrive in our culture.

It isn't a matter of sitting on a street corner and shouting at sinners. It's a time to get involved Amos-style in life: write letters to your congregational representatives; work in a soup kitchen; speak up for the right to life; avoid television and movies that corrupt our culture; live simply and give to the poor. Let us ask this no-nonsense voice from the past, the prophet Amos, to help us.

We have just ended the Year for Priests. Please remember and keep on praying for priests.
